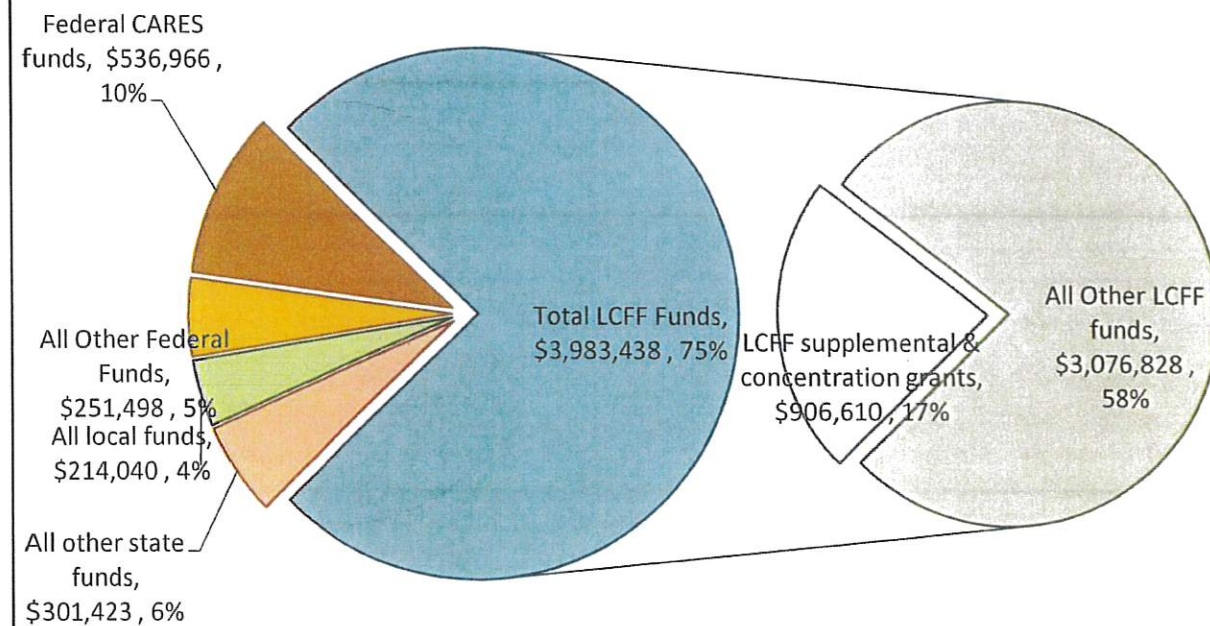

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

Projected Revenue by Fund Source

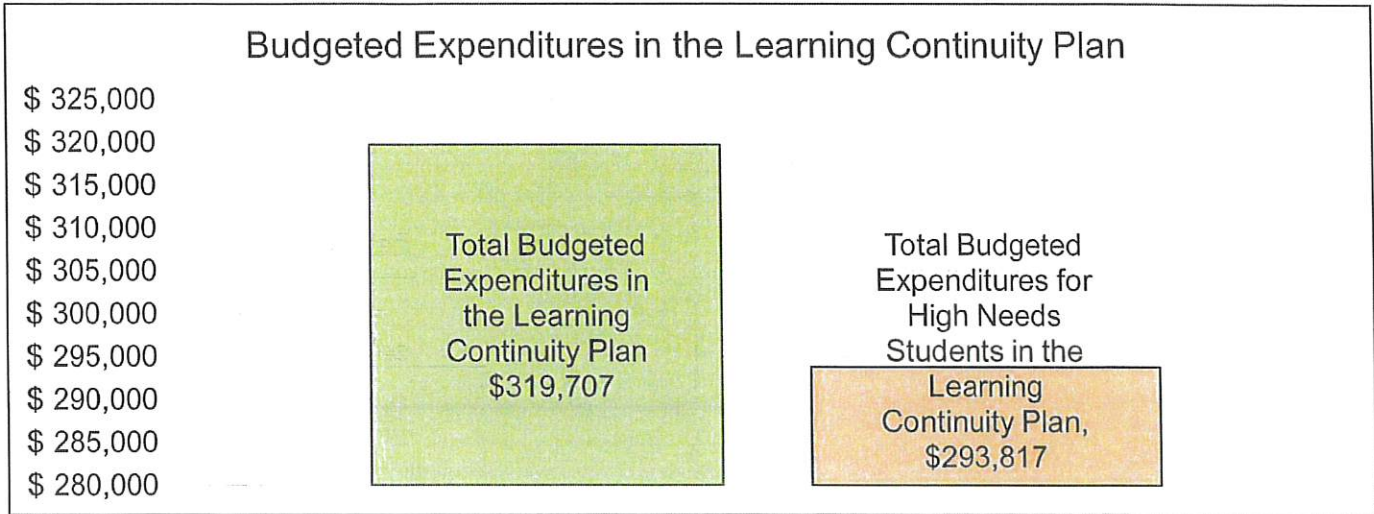


This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Gerber Union Elementary School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Gerber Union Elementary School is \$5,287,365.00, of which \$3,983,438.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$301,423.00 is other state funds, \$214,040.00 is local funds, and \$788,464.00 is federal funds. Of the \$788,464.00 in federal funds, \$536,966.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$3,983,438.00 in LCFF Funds, \$906,610.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Gerber Union Elementary School plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Gerber Union Elementary School plans to spend \$5,504,410.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$319,707.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$5,184,703.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

Classroom teacher salaries and benefits are a major portion of the expenditures not in the Learning Continuity Plan. Additional expenditures include, but are not limited to; the cost of additional deferred maintenance of facilities, operational staff including administrative support, transportation base cost, special education contracts, cafeteria expenditures, athletic programs, legal expenses, and retiree benefit contributions.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

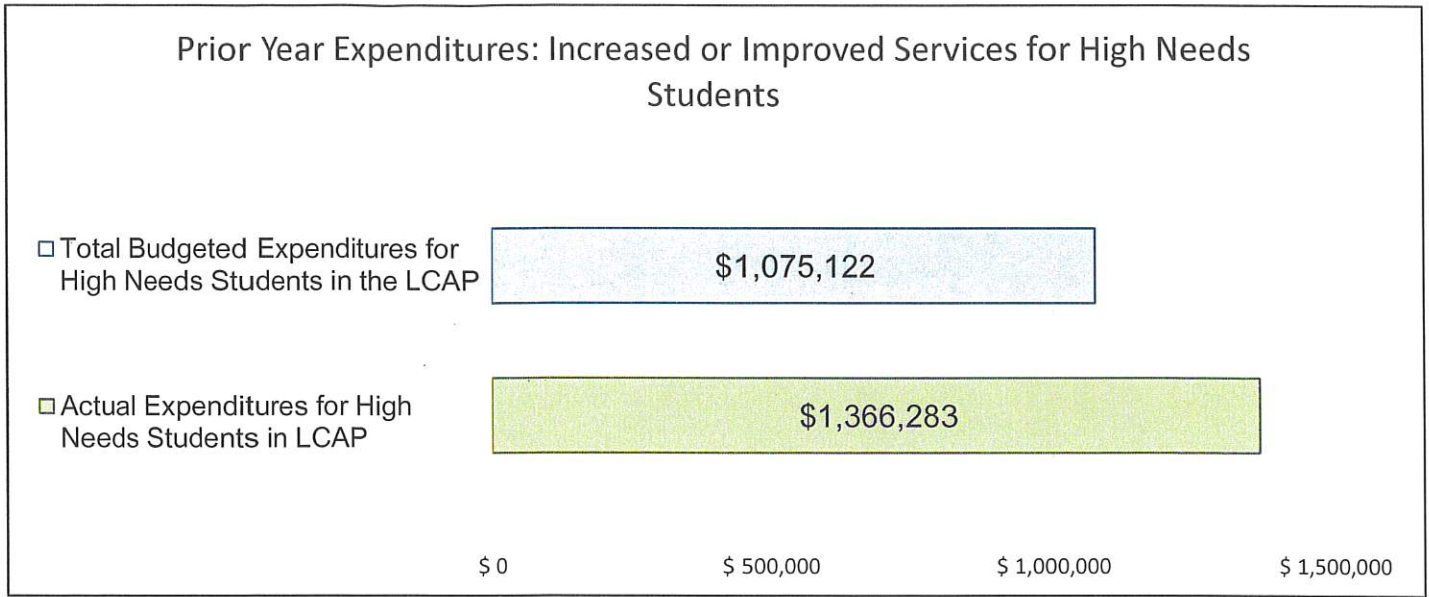
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In 2020-2021, Gerber Union Elementary School is projecting it will receive \$906,610.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Gerber Union Elementary School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. Gerber Union Elementary School plans to spend \$293,817.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

The Learning Continuity Plan was implemented for COVID it wasn't our entire plan. For English learners we maintained a full time ELD teacher to support students and provide supplemental curriculum. Gerber school has a full time Behavior Intervention Coordinator, counselor and psychologist (psychologist contracted 14 days to neighboring district). Gerber school purchased and implemented SEL curriculum for at risk students.

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Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what Gerber Union Elementary School budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Gerber Union Elementary School actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, Gerber Union Elementary School's LCAP budgeted \$1,075,122.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Gerber Union Elementary School actually spent \$1,366,283.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020.
